**As a tier one** research university, UCSB is on the cutting edge of new discoveries that are changing the world.


Our campus' undergraduate focus means students have the opportunity to be active members of this research community—and it's not all lab coats and test tubes. Our students also push creative boundaries, explore the nature of humanity, and discuss solutions for society's challenges. Whichever questions you ask, we'll support you in seeking the answers. Undergraduate Research and Creative Activities (URCA) grants fund student research projects, and the Faculty Research Assistance Program (FRAP) allows students to work with leading UCSB researchers while earning academic credit.



The College of Engineering offers five undergraduate majors that prepare students to design the world of tomorrow. The environment and modern laboratory facilities foster creativity, collaboration, and discovery. Courses balance theory and applied science, leading students to successful careers in academia and industry. An exceptionally low student-to-faculty ratio encourages students to assist professors in cutting-edge research. The Technology Management Program offers entrepreneurial students an understanding of business principles so they can successfully run the companies created by their innovations. Outstanding students can take advantage of combined Bachelor of Science/Master of Science (BS/MS) programs that provide an opportunity to earn two degrees in five years.

The College of Creative Studies supports highly motivated students in research and the creation of new knowledge in one of eight disciplines in science, humanities, and the arts. Small seminars and close mentorship by faculty permit students to make original contributions to their fields while still having access to classes and resources across campus. Applicants must submit a supplemental application for review by faculty.

**Living in paradise** has its perks. UCSB Housing operates residence halls, undergraduate apartments, and family student housing. Many rooms have ocean or mountain views, and Living-Learning Communities in the residence halls connect students with similar interests. The campus is also home to four Dining Commons that offer fresh, sustainable, local, and organic food in an all-you-care-to-eat setting. Students can select a meal plan that works for them ranging from seven meals per week to an unlimited pass.


